Thank you for contacting me about this fantastic program named the "Save A Life" Tour from Kramer Entertainment. I cannot compliment Dave and Todd enough for their dedication, energy, cooperation and effectiveness of the program. They truly showed their professionalism from the time they took to the road from a program in Slippery Rock where they were stuck in a snow and ice storm until the time they left the Central Bucks School District to head to West Virginia. When they arrived at Central Bucks South High School after little sleep, they once again showed their abilities in creating a most effective program, which they did throughout those three days at CB East and CB West.

Dave spoke of his parents being paralyzed and the loss of his best friend by a drunk driver and Todd, whom was not used to telling his story stood up and spoke at all three high schools before an audience of 300 teenagers in each class (approximately 3,500) where you could have heard a pin drop. I have led many programs in the middle and high schools in this district and never have I heard the audience so quiet and taken by what Todd was saying. Both gentlemen and I do mean gentlemen left quite an impact on the Save A Life Tour audience and made the program what it truly stands for and that is to save a life. Hopefully, many lives.


The simulation was an intense one and one that students hopefully will learn from. There were a few students taken from the audience who had their learner's permit and will learn what not to do when they do get their license. It was interesting to note that reactions varied from school to school. For the most part, students took it seriously and well they should! Driving drunk is no laughing matter.

Within the past month we have had two serious accidents in this area involving young people. One accident (in my township) involved the death of three young boys where the driver had his license less than 24 hours. The other accident killed two teenagers. Both accidents involved speed and the lack of driving experience. The D.E.E.P. (Drug Education & Effective Programs) organization that I co-founded several years ago and whom brought the SALT will continue to educate our youth to make good choices. It's a difficult job, but as the police have reported the number of DUI arrests and accidents of young people have gone down since our programs in the schools.

Thank you Dave for contacting me about the Save A Life Tour. May you bring this to as many schools as possible and may a valuable lesson be learned to save as many lives as you can.

And please promote Todd and Dave as motivational speakers. They are worth their weight in gold and are truly an inspiration in getting the message out there.
